Crucifixion and Resurrection

Matthew 26:36–28:10

Jesus took His disciples to the garden of Gethsemane. He knew that He was about to die. Three times Jesus prayed, “Father, please let this cup pass from Me. Not My will but Your will be done.”

Suddenly, Judas arrived with a large crowd carrying swords and clubs. Judas kissed Jesus on the cheek so the crowd would know who Jesus was. The men grabbed Jesus and arrested Him.

Peter, one of Jesus’ disciples, followed Jesus at a distance to the high priest’s courtyard. While Peter waited outside, some people said, “You were with Jesus.” Three times Peter said that he did not know Jesus.

Then the leaders took Jesus to Pilate, the governor. Pilate could not find that Jesus had done anything wrong. He tried to set Jesus free, but the crowds shouted, “Crucify Him!” Pilate agreed to put Jesus to death.

Soldiers beat Jesus, put a robe on Him, and placed a crown of sharp thorns on His head. They led Jesus to a place called Golgotha and nailed Him to a cross. From noon until three in the afternoon, darkness covered the land. Jesus cried out, “My God, My God, why have You abandoned (turned away from) Me?” Soon after, Jesus shouted again with a loud voice, and then He died.

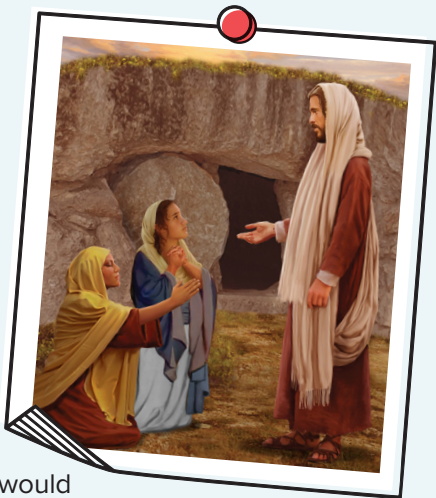
One of the guards said, “This man really was the Son of God!”

That evening Jesus’ body was placed in a tomb and a large stone was rolled against the entrance. Guards were posted to stop anyone from taking His body. But on the third day, guards could not stop the earthquake that shook the ground or the angel who rolled back the stone. The guards were so afraid that they dropped to the ground as if they were dead!

When some women went to the tomb to care for Jesus’ body, they could not find Him. The angel said, “He is not here! He is risen, just as He said! Come and see!”

As the women ran to tell Jesus’ disciples the news, Jesus met them. “Greetings!” Jesus said. The women fell at Jesus’ feet and worshiped Him. “Don’t be afraid,” Jesus told them. “Go tell My brothers they will see Me in Galilee.”
