

FAMILY CONNECTION

Use the following thoughts and questions to have a spiritual conversation as a family. Don't emphasize having the right answer, but focus on spending time discussing the Word as a family.

SCRIPTURE | John 4:7-30

SESSION SUMMARY

Throughout the Gospels, Jesus revealed that He wasn't concerned with cultural norms. He was concerned with doing what God had sent Him to do: make a way for us to be saved from sin. That was most important to Him, and should be to us, as we see in the story of the woman at the well. Through Jesus's interaction with her, we're reminded that Jesus knows us fully and still loves us deeply. Here are the key points from this week's session:

- God's love breaks barriers (John 4:7-14).
- God's love satisfies (John 4:15-30).

CONVERSATION QUESTIONS

- What are each family member's go-tos for comfort and enjoyment (ex: movies, books, relationships, foods, etc.)?
- How is Jesus a better go-to for all our family's struggles and joys? What can we do to remind ourselves of this?
- Why is it important to recognize that Jesus loves us and is for us, even when we mess up?

FAMILY CHALLENGE

Think about the people our culture tends to value less or more than others and why people might categorize others as better or worse. Consider where your family struggles specifically. Pray together, asking God to guide you as you humble yourselves and ask Him to reveal the ways you unfairly categorize people. Seek God's forgiveness and clarity. Brainstorm ways you can practice loving others well, no matter their social or economic status or how much or little you have in common with them. See if you can find ways to act on your ideas this week.
